
Hiroshima University



Hiroshima University is a national institution founded in 1949, incorporating many different institutions of higher education. The University has been growing ever since; adding new schools, research institutes, and centers. Today it is counted among the national universities and consists of 12 schools, 11 graduate schools, a research institute, research facilities, and affiliated hospitals. The University has approximately 11,000 undergraduate students and 4,500 graduate students currently enrolled, as well as around 1,900 international students from approximately 70 different countries.

Today, HU is making steady progress as a global university, taking on worldwide challenges and strengthening its global educational network by signing international exchange agreements with universities around the world and opening overseas bases at strategic locations.

Kyoto University



Kyoto University was founded in 1897 in the City of Kyoto, Japan's historic center of art, culture, and scholarship. Since its founding, the university has cultivated a distinctive academic tradition emphasizing the value of free and open-minded dialogue and fostering a spirit of individuality and autonomy in its scholars. Our university boasts 10 Nobel Prize winners. Our graduates routinely go on to play important roles in both national and international affairs as key players. Kyoto University currently comprises 10 faculties, 18 graduate schools, 13 research institutions, and 23 educational institutes and other establishments. Approximately 2,600 of the university's 23,400 students hail from overseas, with students from over 110 different countries and regions, our campuses boast a rich culture diversity.

Niigata University



Niigata University (NU) has a long history and a rich tradition, with its predecessor organizations dating back about 150 years. Since its founding, the university has played a vital role as a center of higher education and advanced research in Japan, aiming to contribute to world peace and development, blessed with an abundance of nature offering the ideal environment for students and researchers. With a student body of approximately 12,000 students and 3,000 academic and administrative members, today, NU has developed into a large-scale, comprehensive university with two campuses, a university hospital and several research institutes including the Brain Research Institute and the Research Institute for Natural Hazards and Disaster Recovery. Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral degree programs at NU cover a wide range of academic fields: humanities, education, law, economics, science, medicine, health sciences, dentistry, engineering and agriculture. Osaka University

Osaka University was the sixth imperial university in Japan, founded in 1931 with the strong support of the citizens, businesses, and governmental leaders of Osaka. It has been recognized as one of the leading research universities in the world and is at the forefront of technological and social innovation.

Numerous prominent scientists have worked at Osaka University such as the Nobel Laureate in Physics Hideki Yukawa. It is the 4th best ranked higher education institution in Japan (71st worldwide) in 2019 by the QS World University Rankings.

In October of 2007, Osaka University and Osaka University of Foreign Studies merged, continuing our development as one of the most prominent comprehensive research universities in the nation.

We now have 11 undergraduate schools, 16 graduate schools, 6 research institutes, 2 hospitals, 4 libraries and 17 collaborative education research facilities on campus, including national joint-use facilities. In addition, we have World-leading research centers such as Immunology Frontier Research Center (iFReC) and the Center for Information and Neural Networks (CiNet).

Tokai University is a private university established by Dr. Shigeyoshi Matsumae in1942 to nurture young people who can contribute to the world peace. Tokai University consists of 7 campuses in Sapporo, Takanawa, Yoyogi, Shonan, Isehara, Shimizu, and Kumamoto, which are composed of 19 undergraduate schools made up of 75 majors and 19 graduate schools. The total student population is about 30,000 and 1100 of those are international students. Tokai University has six offices abroad (Denmark, Vienna, Hawaii, Korea, Thailand and Vladivostok), and maintains academic exchange agreements with more than 125 universities/organizations in 39 countries.

Tokyo Institute of Technology



Tokyo Tech is the top national university for science and technology in Japan with a history spanning more than 130 years. Of the approximately 10,000 students at the Ookayama, Suzukakedai, and Tamachi Campuses, half are in their bachelor's degree program while the other half are in master's and doctoral degree programs. International students number 1,800. There are 1,200 faculty and 600 administrative and technical staff members.

In the 21st century, the role of science and technology universities has become increasingly important. Tokyo Tech continues to develop global leaders in the fields of science and technology, and contributes to the betterment of society through its research, focusing on solutions to global issues. The Institute's long-term goal is to become the world's leading science and technology university.





Tokyo University of Marine Science and Technology



Tokyo University of Marine Science and Technology (TUMSA) has been provided education to develop specialists who helped govern and manage ocean use in Japan. Based on its motto "Voices from the Ocean" TUMSAT has focused its efforts since the merger on fulfilling its mission to help Japan develop as a maritime nation and play a role in its contributions to the international community. From this fundamental perspective, we offer students opportunities for comprehensive education and research related to the ocean with a focus on the development of highly specialized researchers and professionals. Our aim is to form an internationally outstanding center for marine education and research in order to develop specialists who will play leading roles in industry, government and academia in international settings. Furthermore, taking advantage of our specialization in oceanography, we particularly focus on promoting and advancing global scientific research in the maritime field, comprehensively covering the environment, resources and energy.





Tokyo University of Foreign Studies



Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (TUFS) is one of the oldest universities in Japan. Founded in 1873, this prominent university has conducted academic research on languages, cultures, and societies of all regions across the globe. When first reestablished as a university under the post-war education system in 1949, TUFS had only one undergraduate program with twelve departments.

Today, TUFS has three undergraduate schools, the School of Language and Culture Studies, the School of International Area Studies, and the School of Japan Studies; one graduate school, the Graduate School of Global Studies; and two affiliated organizations, the Research Institute for Language and Cultures of Asia and Africa, and the Japanese Language Center for International Students. In 2019, the "Joint Doctoral Program for Sustainability Research" was established in cooperation with two neighboring universities.

Currently, TUFS offers majors in 28 languages and a total of 75 languages to study. The mission of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies is to conduct research and instruction, both theoretical and practical, on the world's languages and the cultures rooted in them. We aim to provide the cultural refinement necessary to engage in international activities, and to deepen the understanding of regions around the world through the study of their

Tokyo University of the Arts



Tokyo University of the Arts was founded in May 1949 under the National School Establishment Law (Act No. 150 of 1949) through a merger of Tokyo Fine Arts School (currently the Faculty of Fine Arts) and Tokyo Music School (currently the Faculty of Music). At the time of its establishment, the university comprised ten departments in two faculties, the Faculty of Fine Arts (Departments of Painting, Sculpture, Crafts, Architecture, and Aesthetics and Art History), the Faculty of Music (Departments of Composition, Vocal Music, Instrumental Music, Conducting, and Musicology), as well as the University Library.

The Graduate School comprises four schools; the Graduate School of Fine Arts, the Graduate School of Music, the Graduate School of Film and New Media, and the Graduate School of Global Arts. The university also contains the Music High School and an education and research facility attached to the Faculty of Music.

In this way, Tottori University has vigorous activities across various fields with the fundamental concept of "Fusion of Knowledge and Practice" and is contributing to the advancement of local areas and the worlds as the "Bastion of Knowledge and Lands".



University of Tsukuba

Since its inception in Tsukuba Science City in 1973, the University of Tsukuba has offered a comprehensive curriculum of education, covering everything from literature and science to fine arts and physical education. Although the university's roots stretch back much further than 40 years; its origins lie in the Normal School, the first of its kind in Japan, established in 1872.

The University of Tsukuba is a future-oriented institution, and we have always sought to be an open university offering interdisciplinary education aimed at fostering internationally minded people. With faculties covering humanities, sciences, sports, and art, we are a university in the true sense of the original Latin meaning "the whole," and aim to nurture tomorrow's global leaders through a broad-ranging pursuit of academic excellence. Indeed, we seek to leverage our position in center of Tsukuba, Japan's world-leading research hub, to promote harmonious coexistence among all humankind.



The University of Tokyo



The University of Tokyo (UTokyo) was established in 1877 as the first national university in Japan. As a leading research university, UTokyo offers courses in essentially all academic disciplines at both undergraduate and graduate levels and conducts research across the full spectrum of academic activity. The University aims to provide its students with a rich and varied academic environment that ensures opportunities for both intellectual development and the acquisition of professional knowledge and skills.

UTokyo is known for the excellence of its faculty and students, and since its foundation, many of its graduates have gone on to become leaders in government, business, and academia.

Currently, UTokyo is comprised of 10 Faculties, 15 Graduate Schools, 35 affiliated research institutes (including the Research Center for Advanced Science and Technology, and University-wide centers), three affiliated libraries and three institutes for advanced study.

Furthermore, the Faculties, Graduate Schools and research institutes have facilities associated with them; for instance, the University of Tokyo Hospital is one such facility.

In addition to the three main campuses of Hongo, Komaba and Kashiwa, facilities affiliated with UTokyo are spread throughout Japan.



Waseda University



First established in early 1882, Waseda University, a top institution of higher education based in central Tokyo, has 50,000 students in 13 undergraduate and 20 postgraduate schools. It was founded on three principles: independence of scholarship, practical application of scholarship and fostering of good citizenship. Waseda's mission is to build leaders, and it does, producing seven prime ministers and countless other leaders in government, business, journalism, science, literature and the arts. Waseda is Japan's most global campus, with over 7000 international students from 120 countries, and partnerships with over 800 prominent institutions in 80 countries.




What is J-MENA project?
